## **Talking Points**

- In my inaugural State of the State Address, I dared Mississippians to imagine computers at the fingertips of every Mississippi school child.
- We set a goal to place an Internet-accessible computer in every public elementary and secondary classroom in Mississippi by the end of 2002.
- Just this week, we have executed contracts with six vendors to place 6,325 Internet-accessible computers in Mississippi school classrooms.
- With the installation of these computers we are more than half way to meeting our goal.
- Installation of these computers has begun and will be in full-swing by March 1, 2001.
- Representatives of the six companies supplying the computers have joined us today.

- They are Business Communications, Incorporated; Dell Computer Corporation; Government Computers Sales, Incorporated; Howard Computers; Logista (Compaq Subcontractor) and Apple.
- The computers supplied by these companies were offered at substantial discounts, and vendors provided value-adds such as web sites, educational software and teacher training at no cost to the state or local school.
- We appreciate these companies' interest in, and support of, Mississippi's teachers and students.
- By placing a computer in every classroom, we are giving teachers another tool to enhance the learning environment for our children.
- We are giving our students the means to open doors that provide countless learning opportunities for them.
- Their educational opportunities are limitless.
- Our students can use this tool to learn and obtain information about current events, e-commerce,

government, science projects, college course offerings, career choices and so much more.

- Today's announcement is possible because of the strong public/private partnership we have formed to raise the funds necessary to purchase the computers.
- The members of the Governor's Task Force on Classroom Technology are to be commended for their fundraising efforts that are helping us place these 6,325 computers in Mississippi classrooms.
- Many members of this Task Force are with us today, and I want to thank them for their continued commitment to this worthwhile project.
- Their efforts have produced outstanding results, but their work is only half-done.
- We are now asking them to double, and triple their efforts to raise the funds needed for the additional computers.

- In the coming weeks Carolyn Shanks, CEO and President of Entergy Mississippi and I will kick off a campaign to secure these funds.
- It is a great feeling to know that we are on right-on-schedule to complete our goal by the end of 2002.
- And we are on track to make Mississippi the first state in the nation to have a computer in every classroom.
- That is the kind of number I like to hear associated with Mississippi.
- First place in providing our educators and our students with a direct link to the world of technology that has a great sound to it.
