- Our goal is to place an Internet-accessible computer in every classroom by the end of the year 2002.
- I am excited to say that we are more than half way to meeting our goal!!
- 6,325 Internet-accessible computers are being installed in classrooms across our state, and will all be in place by the beginning of the 2001-2002 school year.
- We have commitments from Entergy, the Maddox Foundation, Mississippi Power, State Farm, AOL, Jim Barksdale and others.
- Carolyn Shanks, CEO and President of Entergy Mississippi has graciously agreed to serve as my co-chair for the campaign to secure the funds we need to install the remaining computers.
- I would like to ask her to say a few words, Carolyn.
- Carolyn, I appreciate your commitment, and the commitment of Entergy.
- Carolyn talked about the assistance Entergy is giving to this initiative,
- But we need more grassroots help.
- We need your help.
- This is your opportunity to invest in the future workforce of Mississippi.
- By supporting this effort, you can have a hand in shaping the quality of that future workforce.
- We are not just putting a computer in classroom.
- We are giving our students – Mississippi's students – the keys to a brighter future.
- We are giving our teachers better tools with which to teach our students.
