

Visit Your Governor's Mansion

First occupied in 1842, the Mississippi Governor's Mansion is the second-oldest continuously occupied governor's residence in the United States. Designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1975, the Mansion was completely renovated during that time. The Mansion was reconstructed, restored, and museum-quality antiques were acquired to furnish the historic house.

Located on 300 East Capitol Street, the historic section of the Governor's Mansion is open to the public Tuesday through Friday, 9:30a.m. to 11:00a.m. Guided tours are conducted on the half-hour beginning at 9:30a.m. and ending with the last tour at 11:00a.m. Admission is free and reservations are requested for groups of ten or more.

The Mansion has been the proud host to many famous Mississippians including Morgan Freeman, Walker Percy, Leontyne Price, and Eudora Welty. We proudly invite you as our special guest on a tour of this beautifully restored architectural masterwork.
