

On March 3, 2000 Governor Ronnie Musgrove established the Governor's Task Force for Classroom Technology. The purpose of the Task Force is to accomplish the goal of placing an Internet-accessible computer in every public, elementary and secondary classroom in Mississippi by the end of 2002.

“We are bringing the resources of the World Wide Web to Mississippi's school children and teachers by placing an Internet-accessible computer in every classroom of every public school in the State of Mississippi,” said Governor Ronnie Musgrove. “The computer can open the door to provide countless learning opportunities for our students, and begins the technology training they will need to enter today's workforce.”

Recognizing the importance of technology in the economic development and growth of our state, Governor Musgrove has appointed members of the Electronic Government Commission. The Commission will advise the Governor regarding technology infrastructure, and propose recommendations to ensure increased efficiency and effectiveness of electronic government.
