

A Proclamation
by
Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, by the provisions of Section 121 of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, the Governor is vested with the power to convene, by public Proclamation, the Legislature in Extraordinary Session whenever, in his judgment, the public interest requires it; and

WHEREAS, it is my judgment that the public interest requires that the Legislature be convened in Extraordinary Session for the consideration of the matters hereinafter stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, do hereby issue this Proclamation to convene the Legislature in the Third Extraordinary Session of 2002, and do designate Thursday, September 5, 2002, at 10:00 a.m., as the time, and the State Capitol in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as the place, in which said Session shall be convened; and do designate as the subjects to be considered at said Third Extraordinary Session of 2002, when so convened, the following matter:

1. An Act to amend Chapter 135, Laws of 2002 (Senate Bill No. 3163), to revise Section 1 to specify the amount of general funds appropriated to the Department of Corrections to be \$227,725,528 and Section 3 to specify the amount of general funds appropriated to the Department of Corrections for the support and maintenance of prisons operated by private companies to be \$48,717,913 and to remove language restricting the transfer of funds.
2. An Act making an appropriation for the expenses of the Legislature for the Third Extraordinary Session of 2002.
3. Such other matters as may be submitted by the Governor for consideration during such Third Extraordinary Session of 2002.
