Have called on Legislature to fund education in one comprehensive bill

- o Fund it at 62 percent of general fund
- Time to prove to you that when it comes

- Have continued to create quality jobs during national recession
 - Nearly 50,000 new jobs in past three years / \$13.5 billion invested

Building jobs across the spectrum
