 - They are true professionals doing work we often don't know about
 - o Silent efforts to ensure safety of us all

Since events of 9/11, we've lived on the edge

- Americans everywhere have walked a delicate line between fear and readiness
- Confident now that we are ready here in Mississippi

 Monday night President Bush offered ultimatum to Saddam Hussein

 Get out in 48 hours or war begins
 Time's almost up

America's troops, including more than 4,000 of our own Guard and Reserve personnel, are on the front lines

o Let's keep them in our prayers

Here at home in Mississippi, you are the ones on the front lines

- You are well-trained, well-prepared for any scenario
- Since 9/11, you've done more and learned more than ever before

Time to put that training to use

- Signed state of emergency / executive order yesterday
- o Raised threat level to orange (high)

- A couple of weeks ago, we called on
 President Bush and Secretary Ridge to
 release federal funds for our emergency
 responders
 - That was done a few days later / \$7.5
 million for Mississippi
 - Funds to support training, equipment,
 risk and needs assessments
- You must have the tools to do your jobs / protect the people of Mississippi
 - Even if funds not available, we will get the job done
 - o There is no other alternative

■We've been preparing for this day since 9/11

- o Summit on Domestic Preparedness
- Bioterrorism exercises held around the state
- Incident Command System established to ensure all levels of emergency personnel use common terminology, unified command, integrated communications

- February 5, signed Executive Order 874
 establishing State Interoperability Executive
 Committee
 - o Charged with:
 - Coordinating information between state agencies
 - Providing recommendations for immediate and long-term improvement of public safety wireless communications
- Cannot afford to relive problems of 9/11
 where fire and police personnel in New
 York were unable to communicate
 effectively, with tragic consequences

- This work will be stepped up to ensure we are completely ready
- Want to assure everyone here today that we are going to continue to work together
 - Municipal and county governments will be involved in decision-making and planning
 - Guidelines and support will be available from state agencies
- No emergency responder in Mississippi will be alone in reacting to a situation
 - We are all in this together / that will not change

Thank you for your courage and commitment to your jobs and those you serve

- This is going to be a difficult time for all Mississippians
- I have confidence in your abilities and skills

It's also a difficult time for our nation / world

- o Let's keep each other in our prayers
- Also pray for President / soldiers / innocent civilians caught in this struggle
- Pray for strength and resolve to see this through to the end
