Remarks for the Swearing-In of Frank Melton March 14, 2003

When I introduced Frank Melton as my choice to head up the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics last December, I said this about him: "He has the management experience and the leadership capabilities needed at the Bureau, and I am confident he will take on this position with respect for its officers and a commitment to stepping up the fight against drugs in our state."

I believed in those words then, and I believe in them even more today. Frank Melton has taken on the challenge of leading the Bureau of Narcotics in the war on drugs in Mississippi, and I'm glad he did. He is committed to making a difference. He is working without a salary. He is dedicated to the men and women of the Bureau. He is the right man for the job.

When you combine his belief in the goodness of our young people and his hope for their future with his frustration and anger toward the dealers intent on scarring that goodness and eliminating that hope, you have a force to be reckoned with.

I believed last December that Frank Melton was the right man to lead the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics. The Mississippi Senate has agreed with me. Today, it all becomes official.

Frank, congratulations – and thank you for your leadership and your dedication to winning Mississippi's war on drugs.
