Main Points

- 1. Advantage Mississippi
 - a. Technology propels this new economy
 - i. Making borders obsolete and trading geographic divides for digital divides
 - ii. New world demands that MS explore new approaches to attracting and expanding job opportunities
 - iii. Expand the World Wide Web to include MS

- b. Plan is not for one region over another. It helps all Mississippians in all 82 counties
 - i. MS is in a position to be considered for top companies
 - ii. Plan to bring higher paying jobs to our people
 - iii. Objective must be to create a higher quality-of-place
- c. Improving basic infrastructure, transportation and information, to support community and capacity building
 - i. Broaden deployment of high-speed data and Internet access capabilities
 - ii. Leverage EdNet to fully utilize this resource
 - iii. Focus training and re-training programs to boost workforce high tech aptitude and capabilities
 - iv. Establish a Chief Technology Officer position as a part of the state's development authority
- d. Leverage the strength of MS's universities taking a "cluster approach" to target industries that fit best for MS's future
- e. Bring World Trade Center status to MS
 - i. Provide for the coordination of all existing international programs and services in the state

ii. Provides trade services to the private sector and opens the door to a myriad of resources, programs and services MS businesses can utilize to further penetrate the growing world market

f. Internet Technology

i. Can eliminate borders, open national and international doors to Mississippi businesses

A Task Force by Executive Order was establish August 8, 2000, to assist in implement e-government. The Task Force will work to draft a plan in time for consideration during the 2001 regular session.

2. E-Government Commission

- a. Establishing E-commerce is critical
- b. As the environment in which we do business changes, so must the environment in which we conduct the public's business
- c. Advancement of Technology in every part of the world, is moving the expansion of e-commerce at the "speed of light"
- d. We have to keep up to be competitive, but we don't want to be "just competitive", we want to lead the nation and the world

- e. I have created a task force to explore and implement e-government
 - i. Make the government more customer friendly
 - ii. Make the government simple and easy to access
 - iii. We want Mississippi's e-government to lead the nation and serve as the model for other states
- 3. MTI/ ITD: Mississippi Technology, Inc. & the Institute of Technology Development
 - a. MTI promotes and coordinates science and technology-based economic development, while the Inst. Of Technology Development focuses on technology commercialization for the State of MS
 - b. Dr. Angie Dvorak is the new CEO/President MTI & the Inst. Of Technology Development
 - c. Dr. Dvorak has a long history of promoting the value of technology-based economic development and will do an outstanding job of helping to bring quality, high paying jobs to the people of Mississippi.

d. Dr.Dvorak will also bring about a coordinated effort to pull together all of our resources, coordinating among MTI, ITD, the MS Development Authority, other existing entities and the private sector

- a. There has been a lot of talk lately about a major company/industry locating here in MS
- b. Wouldn't it be great to think that we have worked hard enough in 10 months of our administration to put MS on the map for a large company to consider us for a possible locations site?
- c. By making dramatic changes in our economic strategy, we made MS competitive with other states
- d. Advanced technology is a key component to what business and industry are looking for in a state to have.
- e. Now our job is spreading the word that MS has the right incentives and the right workforce to help make companies successful
