Main Points

- 1. State Budget
 - a. A Progressive approach to budgeting
 - i. More accountable with fewer excuses
 - ii. Making basic changes to the way we develop the budget for the State
 - iii. First time to present our budget to the Committee at the beginning of the budget process vs. at the end of the process by former Governors
 - iv. A complete budget that is accountable and meets the needs of the people

b. Priorities of the Budget

- i. Education is one of the top priorities
 - 1. Recommendations submitted are pro-education
 - a. Teacher pay raises
 - b. Fully funding the adequate education program
 - c. Scholarship funds for teachers

ii. Health Insurance

- 1. Recommended that \$5 million be spent to offset health insurance costs
 - a. Crucial that people don't experience a reduction in medical coverage
 - b. Funds to replace money used for Medicaid services

c. Responsibility of Agency Directors

- i. Give them the flexibility to evaluate programs, question procedures and make tough decisions
- ii. The budget in it's current form, ties the hands of the people who manage the departments
- iii. Giving agency directors the authority to shift money within the dept. according to needs of our people

- iv. Agency directors know what programs are the most effective and help the greatest number of Mississippians
- 2. Economic Development
 - a. Plan not updated in 11 years
 - b. Now it is
 - i. Sound/Comprehensive
 - ii. Variety of Incentives
 - c. Now MS has a management tool to sell the state
 - i. Designed by business leaders across the state and noted E.D. experts throughout the nation
 - ii. Had the strong support of business people and local developers
 - 1. They knew how important it was for our plan to pass and become reality
 - iii. We are in direct competition with our sister states
 - d. The plan helps those communities that have not prospered
 - i. Gives opportunities for all cities/counties
 - ii. Begin using immediately

- iii. Sends a signal to the nation Serious about Business
- iv. A Marketing Plan being developed to sell the state
- e. More, higher paying jobs for people of Mississippi
 - i. Competing with other states for those jobs
 - ii. We now have a competitive advantage
 - iii. Creates a better Quality of Life for every person in all 82 counties
- f. Key elements of the Package
 - i. Name Change
 - 1. Mississippi Development Authority
 - ii. Ace Fund
 - iii. Regional Economic Development Act
 - iv. Mississippi Advantage Jobs Act
 - 1. Allows qualifying businesses to receive up to 4% of their employee's wages back at the end of each quarter as a rebate from MS Tax Comm.
 - v. Growth & Prosperity Act
 - 1. 10-year exemptions (including school taxes) to

qualifying companies locating in designated counties

vi. Tax Credit Amendments

- 1. Mixture of tax credit incentives targeting high-tech, research and higher paying jobs
- vii. Workforce Training & Retraining
 - 1. Allows flexibility for the state to make multi-year commitments for workforce training and retention support
- 3. Fast Forward Mississippi
 - a. Eases transition from School-to-Careers
 - b. Helps students from kindergarten to college age and beyond to realize the world of career opportunities that await them
 - c. With Fast Forward Mississippi
 - i. Can learn about career options
 - ii. Research facts on different careers
 - iii. Educational choices
 - iv. Technical skills
 - v. Training options
 - d. Utilizes the Internet and web technology
 - i. Creates a one-stop resource for students, parents and teachers
