- Ladies and Gentlemen, distinguished guests, I know the Lt. Governor and the Speaker join Melanie and myself in saying that we are honored to have Their Majesties with us today.

- It is my pleasure to welcome each of you and to present Their Majesties, King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sofia of Spain.
- King Juan Carlos was proclaimed King of Spain in November 1975.
- In his first message to the nation, he expressed the basic ideas of his reign, to restore democracy.
- In 1977, the first democratic election in Spain since 1936 was held and the new Parliament drafted the text of the current Constitution.
- The King has encouraged relations with Latin America, bringing together two cultures with a common language, to promote international relations.

- Queen Sofia is actively involved in many social and charity activities.
- She takes special interest in the Foundation for Aid for Drug Addicts, where she personally speaks at conferences and meetings on the subject in Spain and worldwide.
- Queen Sofia's fondness for music is well known, and she is an honorary member of the San Fernando Academy of Fine Arts.
- Two weeks from today, Their Majesties will celebrate 39 years as husband and wife.
- Melanie and I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Their Majesties and wish them many more happy years.
- It is my hope that Mississippi and Spain's future will forever be sealed as tightly as the bond between King Juan Carlos and Queen Sofia.
- Mississippi and Spain have crossed international and cultural boundaries today.

- The Majesty of Spain exhibition has given us this wonderful opportunity to unite our two cultures and to open the doors for more cultural and economic development opportunities between Mississippi and Spain.

- As a token of our appreciation to Spain and a memento for the King & Queen's visit to Mississippi, we would like to present you with these gifts.
