 - b. \$930 million investment in the State of Mississippi
 - c. It is also further recognition that we have the quality workforce, workforce training programs and commitment to business growth that it takes to be competitive and successful
 - i. A vote of confidence in the people of our state

- ii. Nissan has shown their faith in the state of MS
- d. Getting to that point was a team effort on all levels
- e. Because of the hard work of many individuals and agencies, we are able to celebrate the arrival of this new company to MS.
- f. Our state is poised to make huge gains in creating quality jobs, expanding the resources of existing MS businesses and attracting the interest of national and international companies
- g. We have worked hard enough in 10 months of our administration to put MS on the map for a large company to consider us for a possible locations site
- h. By making dramatic changes in our economic strategy, we made MS competitive with other states

 - c. That strong education begins in K-12
 - i. Good teachers
 - 1. Competitive salaries
 - a. Helps recruit students into teaching field
 - b. Keeps good teachers in the classroom
 - ii. Computers in the classroom
 - 1. Internet-accessible computers
 - 2. Task Force goal end of 2002.
- 3. Showing Leadership
 - d. By forming common objectives and by seeing beyond the politics of self-imposed borders and finding consensus, MS can compete successfully against our

- neighboring states and against countries around the globe.
- e. We are creating the right climate for economic growth by improving infrastructure and institutions, establishing rules and incentives that encourage productivity and implementing positive, long-term processes.
- f. When we talk about infrastructure, we must be mindful that bringing transportation resources to a company's door means more than simply providing a way to move physical goods.
- g. Infrastructure efforts must also focus on the transportation of high speed data with broadband Internet access provided in concert with expanded physical transportation resources.
 - i. Working with MCI WorldCom to provide broadband Internet access to every community in MS
- h. We must go about it in the right way.
 - i. By working together
 - ii. By building consensus
 - iii. By getting rid of our own agendas
 - iv. By working for the good of our people
