  - f. Transportation services to elderly and disabled in need of healthcare and other services
  - g. And the list goes on and on.....

  - a. Community Action Agencies employ more than 2,400 people statewide
  - b. More than 1.5 million hours of volunteer services are documented by Community Action Agencies.
- 3. Since becoming the First Lady of the State of Mississippi, I have the accepted the responsibility of serving as the Spokesperson for the State of Mississippi's President's Student Service Challenge Scholarship Program
  - a. Promotes service learning for students
  - b. Rewards students with recognition and scholarships
  - c. Most importantly it:
    - i. Instills the importance of giving back to the community
    - ii. Helping those who are less fortunate
    - iii. Concern for others
    - iv. Making communities and our state better and stronger

d. It is vital that our young people learn the importance of service and volunteerism because their attitudes toward one another will shape the future for our state.
