- Recognize Beverly Sanders
 - Want to start by thanking you for commitment / dedication to making a difference for MS
- More important than ever to set priorities and stick to them
 - o That's what we've been doing in MS

- Impact of national recession
 - More than \$7 trillion lost in stock market
 - More than two million Americans out of work
 - States cutting school week / releasing prisoners / massive lay-offs
- ■Effects of national recession touches everyone
 - Recession has no respect for political parties
 - o Every state affected

- Have to deal with the impact here in MS
 - Protect people in short term / prepare for long term
- Best way to do that is through creating jobs and investing in education
 - o Everybody benefits from good schools
- ■Education must be first priority for MS
 - Making great progress
 - Teacher pay
 - Test scores
 - Computers in Classroom

- Keeping education a priority with a budget that puts Schools First / 62 percent
 - HISTORIC ACTION THAT WAS
 TAKEN
 - UNPRECENDENTED COOPERATION
 - WAS A HISTORIC DAY WHEN
 SIGNED EDUCATION BILLS
- ■Budget is key issue of legislative session
 - Must budget based on real numbers, not on hope
 - o Funding education at 62%
 - o Fully funding MAEP for the first time
 - o Funds teacher pay raise

- Earlier I mentioned the national recession / impact on states and how we have to prepare for the long term
 - o That's what we're doing here
 - MS is first state in the nation to fund education, and fund it first
 - Others are looking to us now for guidance / leadership
 - o That's a good position to be in
- Also want to take a moment to discuss issue of health insurance
 - We've made good progress investing in education / teachers
 - Not going to lose that progress on this issue

- My budget last November anticipated this insurance issue
 - o Funded \$18.8 million to cover rise in premium
 - This funding needs to be put in place now
- We have to look to the future of MS / where do we want to go?
 - Good schools / good jobs / good communities
- Have to continue investing in education
 - o More computers in classrooms
 - o Higher test scores
 - o Better funding for higher education
