## MEDICAID PRESS CONFERENCE

- AS CURRENTLY PROPOSED IN HB1794, MEDICAID FUNDING WILL RESULT IN A SEVERE SHORTFALL
- ESTIMATED \$120M SHORTFALL GROWS TO \$480M WITH 3:1 FEDERAL MATCH
- THIS MEANS \$480M IN HEALTH CARE SERVICES LOST IN MISSISSIPPI
- CHAIRMAN BOBBY MOODY ESTIMATED SHORTFALL OF \$82M, WHICH EQUALS \$328M WITH FEDERAL MATCH
- IN EITHER SCENARIO, CUTS WILL HAVE TO BE MADE TO OPTIONAL SERVICES
- CUTTING EVERY SERVICE EXCEPT NURSING HOMES AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS ONLY AMOUNTS TO APPROXIMATELY \$49M
- BULK OF CUTS WOULD HAVE TO COME FROM NURSING HOMES AND DRUGS
- THIS IS NOT A SCARE TACTIC, BUT I'M AFRAID OF WHAT THESE CUTS WOULD DO TO OUR ELDERLY, DISABLED AND CHILDREN

- THESE CUTS CAN BE AVOIDED
- TODAY, DISCUSSED LETTER FROM GOV. MUSGROVE TO SPEAKER FORD AND LT. GOV. TUCK
- LETTER WAS PART OF AN EFFORT TO FIND COMMON GROUND WITH LEGISLATURE
- ASKED SPEAKER AND LT. GOV. FOR ASSURANCE THAT FUNDS WILL BE PROVIDED TO AVOID CUTS
- IF ASSURANCE GIVEN, GOV. MUSGROVE WON'T VETO MEDICAID BILLS
- ALSO STILL HOPE FOR FLEXIBILITY TO RESTRUCTURE MEDICAID, MAKE IT WORK BETTER
- WE ALL WANT TO DO WHAT'S BEST FOR PEOPLE RECEIVING MEDICAID / FIND COMMON GROUND
