- 1. Health Care
  - a. Mississippi must provide an environment of healthy, educated employees.
    - i. Industries want this for their employees.
    - ii. I have said that education and economic development go hand in hand, but having healthy, happy people is essential for expanding economic development and teaching our children.

- b. A sound, solid health care system is a vital component to our state's success.
- c. Mississippi is looking for ways to strengthen and improve access to health care across our state.
- d. We are providing more opportunities in the health care system for our state's underserved and rural communities.
- e. The Mississippi Rural Health Care Fund will make great strides in helping to find solutions that meet our people's health care needs.
  - i. People in every county, in every area of our state deserve to have access to lifesaving, life-enhancing services.
  - ii. This fun will provide assistance to community health centers, rural clinics, hospitals, physicians, pharmacists and dentists in medically underserved areas of Mississippi.
  - iii. The Rural Health Care Loan Fund will provide more Mississippians better access to a variety of health care options.
  - iv. That means more Mississippians will be getting the medical attention they need.

For the last several years Mississippi has been ranked near the bottom in areas such as heart disease, diabetes, breast cancer screening, overweight teenagers and adults, physical inactivity, emergency room visits and teenage births.

  - i. It explore new ways to develop feasible and accountable solutions, which will

address the health care needs of Mississippi's growing senior adult population.
