I've checked with the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) as to if any other states in the southeastern region might have already released their Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) results. Of course, each state is different, but this will give us some idea of what is happening in other states. Five other southeastern states have released AYP as of Monday, August 25:

Delaware: 2 (10%) of Delaware's 19 districts rated "Superior" (AYP met), while 17 (90%) rated "Academic Review" (AYP not met for one year). On the school level, 61 (35%) of Delaware's 170 schools rated "Superior," 12 (7%) rated "Commendable" (AYP met), 86 (51%) rated "Academic Review" (AYP not met) and 12 (7%) schools rated "Academic Watch" (AYP not met for 2<sup>nd</sup> year and school goes into improvement).

Florida: Florida's info is not very straightforward. I don't understand the matrix in the attached documents. The bottom line, according to the press release, is that "out of approximately 3,000 schools in Florida, over 400 made AYP." Assuming 425 made AYP, this would be 14% of all Florida schools. 450 would be 15% and 475 would increase to 16% of all schools.

Georgia: 1,152 (58%) of Georgia's 1,998 schools made AYP. 846 (42%) of the 1,998 schools did not make AYP. 536 schools (211 Title I schools + 325 non-Title I schools) did not make AYP because 95% of their students in at least one of the subgroups didn't participate. 395 schools (222 Title I schools + 173 non-Title I schools) did not achieve AYP in only 1 or 2 of the subgroups.

Maryland: Again, Maryland's info is not very straightforward. I couldn't find a press release with state results, but I did find the attached matrix that reflects that, as a state, Maryland did not meet AYP in either reading or math for those students on free/reduced lunch, in special education, or LEP students.

West Virginia: 402 (55%) schools made AYP, while 326 (45%) did not.

I'm attaching press releases and other info that I downloaded from each state's web site. Sorry the info is so piece-mealed, but it is all I could find right now. Remember, Mississippi's preliminary results indicate:
