- <u>Upcoming 2003 Math and Reading Release</u>: 2003 math and reading scores will be released in September. The Board voted to have a combined release of both scores, rather than separate releases. As usual, the Board got an advance briefing on the results, but the info was brief. Overall, reading scores remained flat. No state data was presented. Math scores showed significant increases overall. A map we were shown reflected that Mississippi had significant increases between 2000 and 2003.
