- Three years ago, came into office with a comprehensive plan for MississippiThat plan has been working well
- Teacher pay raise

- Princeton Review says testing 6<sup>th</sup> best in nation
  - o Test scores are up
- Top 10 in nationally board certified teachers
- More high school graduates going on to college / 62% / top 10 in nation according to SREB
- ■1<sup>st</sup> state in nation to put Internet-accessible computer in every one of 32,354 public classrooms
- Have done much / time to do more with that plan
- Last November presented budget that invests 62% in education
  - o Need your help in getting it passed
  - Shortchange investment in education, shortchange future
  - o Not an acceptable alternative

- ■Budget also includes \$200 million for "brain trust"
  - \$20M over 10 years to recruit and retain best minds for higher education
  - Research and development key to economic development
