- We are here today to recognize and congratulate 389 Mississippi teachers who are among an <u>elite</u> group of educators.
- These men and women have achieved the <u>highest</u> of <u>professional standards</u> in the field of teaching.
- Mississippi now boasts the <u>4th highest number</u> of teachers achieving National Board Certification <u>in the United States</u>.
- These teachers made the decision to take on this <u>rigorous</u> challenge that will not only make them <u>better teachers</u>, but will also <u>improve</u> the <u>quality of learning</u> for all our students.
- Only <u>51 percent</u> of teachers across the US who applied for the certification, for the 1999-2000 school year, attained this high level of achievement.
- Mississippi's National Board Certified Teachers are going that extra mile to <u>invest</u> in <u>themselves</u> and in turn, <u>invest</u> in our <u>students</u>.
- <u>We</u> are all <u>investing</u> in <u>education</u>.
- Mississippi has taken one of the largest steps forward for the state, in the area of education, by passing legislation to raise teacher pay to the Southeastern average.
- A <u>raise</u> in teacher salaries is an <u>investment</u> in our teachers and our students.
- With higher teacher salaries, Mississippi will be able to recruit <u>new teachers</u> and <u>retain the great ones we have</u>.
