- They are restoring 2,000 acres of wet-pine savanna in Jackson County and 3,300 acres of bottomland hardwood habitat on the upper Pascagoula River.
- They are also working with local residents to build consensus to protect our unique and irreplaceable natural heritage, while taking into

account the value and economic needs of local residents.

- The Nature Conservancy acts for future generations of Mississippians to protect our coastal lands through partnerships they have today.
- The partnerships that will form with the Coastal Corporate Council for the Environment.
