## Remarks for Oktibbeha / Tunica County School Districts March 27, 2002

This is a great day for the students, the teachers and the schools of this district. You have demonstrated your commitment to making a difference – and the commitment has paid off.

Earlier today, I spoke at a conference on volunteerism. The theme of the conference was "Investing in Mississippi's Future:
