    - 2. Party politics slows down progress for the people for whom you are working
  - iii. Concensus Building
  - iv. Building Public Opinion
    - 1. The public needs to have Faith and Trust in their leaders
    - 2. Listen to the People
- d. We must educate and empower the next generation of political leaders

- ii. Help students explore the demands of leadership in a diverse society
- iii. Cultivate student's leadership skills
- iv. Enable students to practice leadership through action
