 - I urged Legislators to support administrative leave for state employees attending parentteacher conferences.

 - The difference between our budget and the Joint Leg. Budget Committee's:
 - K-12 = \$45 million more
 - Comm. & Jr. = \$11.5 million more
 - IHL = \$23 million more
 - Our economy has slowed down, but we are not broke.
 - We have to prioritize.
- Partnerships
 - We must get involved.
