 - Historic action of fully funding education first
 - Franklin D. Roosevelt recognized
 this when he said, "the school is the
 last expenditure upon which
 America should be willing to
 economize"

- That is the way it should always beTest scores are improving
 - with our State Accountability
 system, more than 80% of
 Mississippi public schools have
 achieved a rating of Level 3/
 Successful or higher
 - Under the federal NCLB
 accountability system, 50% of MS
 schools met the Adequate Yearly
 Progress requirements
 - NCLB score: Alabama 33%,
 Delaware 43%, Tennessee 53%,
 and Florida 13%

- Mississippi has its priorities straight
 - Educating and investing in our children today for dividends tomorrow
- Children in this state are our most valuable resource
 - They may only be 1/3 of our population,
 but they are ALL of our future
- My parents always taught us the importance of having a good education
 - It can take you anywhere/ it can open any door
 - With a good education there are no limits to what YOU can accomplish

- I'm a living testament to that
 - O I'm from a town many of you probably have never heard of (TELL YOUR STORY)
 - Yet, I became a senator (first made education a priority), Lt. Governor and now Governor
- It is vital that our children know that they have people behind them, supporting them, and people who are willing to go to bat for them and their futures
 - They see that when the entire community becomes involved in their education process

- Business partnerships with schools are also significant because
 - Demonstrates the direct link between good schools and strong businesses, which lead to good communities and a better Mississippi

- Mississippi has refused to follow other states when they have cut their school weeks and cut funding for schools
- Together we have refused to compromise on our children's future
- Mississippi is now recognized as a leader in education
 - Teacher pay / 49th to 19th / when fully implemented
 - o Computers in the Classroom
 - 6th in the nation in National Board
 Certified Teachers
 - o Princeton Review: Mississippi has 12th best testing system in nation

 Board Certified Teachers

- We're proving to the people of Mississippi, and the rest of the nation, that we're serious about education
 - o Serious about giving our children every advantage we can / so they can compete on the national level / and so one day they can proudly lead Mississippi
