- Leading other states in preparedness for "No Child Left Behind"
- Our test scores are improving
- Last month we announced our State
   Accountability system, more than
   80% of Mississippi public schools
   have achieved a rating of Level
   3/Successful or higher.
- Under the federal NCLB
   accountability system, 50% of MS
   schools met the Adequate Yearly
   Progress requirements for
   reading/language arts and math.
- NCLB score: Alabama 33%,

  Delaware 43%, Tennessee 53%,

  and Florida 13%

- 6<sup>th</sup> in the nation in National Board
   Certified Teachers
- Historic action of funding education first
