- Mississippi has been ravaged by severe weather within the past month.
- Thunderstorms, tornadoes, hail and straight-line winds have affected almost every area of the state.
- Hundreds of individuals and families have been displaced and their lives have been disrupted by the destruction.
- The Mississippi Emergency Management Agency was on site with each storm to begin giving immediate disaster relief.
- They responded quickly to the needs of all of our people, getting damage assessments completed and providing our people with the assistance they need to quickly return their lives to normal.
- Prevention is the key to surviving any disaster, and

- MEMA has been working tirelessly to make our communities safer by educating people to storm warning signs and working with local emergency management officials to make our cities across Mississippi disaster-proof.
- Today, I am pleased to announce that the Mississippi Development Authority is joining the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency's efforts to build residential and community safe rooms and storm shelters that will help protect our citizens from tornadoes and other high winds.
- MDA is providing up to \$150,000 of Community Development Block Grant funds to assist with the construction of safe rooms or storm shelters for housing that is being reconstructed due to storm damage.
