WHEREAS, Representative Mary H. Coleman represents the 65th House District in Hinds County and serves on the County Affairs, Insurance, Public Buildings, Grounds & Lands, Public Health & Welfare and Ways & Means committees; and

WHEREAS, since her election in 1994, Representative Mary H. Coleman has been involved with the National Black Caucus of State Legislators and has served as Vice President for the last four years; and

WHEREAS, she has led some of the most critical new initiatives that will help bring initiative that will connect member legislators to each other and to the districts they represent—in convening the Faith Round Table, she is helping to reformulate the strong relationship of Black State Legislators to the Black Church and other faith groups and her outreach to other Caucus bodies has set a foundation for strong collaborative efforts across district lines, from local to federally elected officials; and
