     Left Behind"
  - Princeton Review: Mississippi has
     6<sup>th</sup> best testing system in nation
  - Mississippi 6<sup>th</sup> in nation in National
     Board Certified Teachers
  - Computers in Classroom

- Mississippi first state in nation to fully fund education and fund it first
  - o Other states cutting to the bone
  - o We're funding at 62 percent
- We're proving to the people of Mississippi that we're serious about education
  - Making the investment now for dividends tomorrow
  - o That's smart business
- When it comes to education, we mean business
  - o Business means jobs

- Job creation from January 2000 to February 2003
  - o 2,103 new and expanded facilities
  - o 50,253 new jobs
  - o Total investment of \$14.1 billion
- Mississippi Rural Economic ImpactAuthority
  - \$20M to help with economic development in rural areas
  - Funding to cover workforce training at community colleges

- Mississippi's potential not exclusive to metropolitan areas
