MDOC Community Services Division Announces New Region Lines

Jackson – The Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) today announced the reorganization of regional assignments for the Community Services Division. The Community Services Division is changing from four identified regions to three regions. The three regions more evenly distribute workloads, caseloads, staffing patterns and geographical boundaries.

"The reorganization of the Community Services regions will provide more equitable community corrections supervision statewide," said Interim Deputy Commissioner Lora Cole.

The Community Services Division, which has 561 employees, is responsible for supervising more than 19,000 offenders statewide.
