## **Governor Appoints Roy Noble Lee, Jr. to Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Commission**

Jackson, MS – Governor Ronnie Musgrove today appointed Roy Noble Lee, Jr., of Forest, Mississippi, to the Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Commission for a five-year term. Lee will represent the Third Congressional District beginning July 1, 2001 and ending June 30, 2006.

“Roy Noble Lee has demonstrated his commitment as a sportsman and conservationist,” said Governor Musgrove. “I am confident his dedication to Mississippi’s great outdoors will continue as a member of the Commission.”

Lee was born on April 14, 1956, in Scott County, Mississippi. He graduated from Forest High School in 1974 and from Mississippi College in 1978 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in history with a minor in English. He received his law degree from the University of Mississippi School of Law in 1981.

He has practiced law in his family firm in Forest since 1981, working on civil, domestic and criminal litigation. Lee has represented the Scott County Board of Supervisors for over 17 years.

Lee has carried a sportsman license for more than 20 years. He has started hunting clubs which participate in programs administered through the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. He is a lifelong hunter and is raising his three children (twins Joseph and Jonathan, and Roy Noble Lee III) to ethically enjoy hunting and fishing in Mississippi. He is married to Paula Brantley Lee of Harpersville.
