CITY OF BATESVILLE AWARDED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GRANT

JACKSON, Miss. – The city of Batesville was recently awarded a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in the amount of \$645,500 for Economic Development Public Improvements. The original application was submitted on behalf of Wal-Mart Stores, Inc.

The funds will be utilized to make improvements to the future site of a new Wal-Mart Supercenter. They include a traffic signal and intersection as well as improved access to the facility. Wal-Mart is investing \$6.9 million for land, building and equipment. The City of Batesville is contributing \$130,000 for the project.

A Wal-Mart store is currently located in Batesville employing 130 citizens. The Supercenter will create 150 additional jobs. At least 51% of those new jobs will be made available to low- to moderate-income persons.
