On Tuesday, August 20, 2002, the Minority Business Enterprise Division of the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA), in cooperation with Nissan North America, will host the third in a series of workshops in the MDA/Nissan Community and Development Training Series. The workshop begins with registration at 8:30 a.m. with programs continuing until 12:15 p.m. at the Nissan Training Center at 152 Watford Parkway, Canton, Mississippi.
