NISSAN SUPPLIERS BRING MORE JOBS AND INVESTMENTS TO MISSISSIPPI

Nissan project produces \$250-million increase above \$930-million plant investment.

The production suppliers announced by Nissan North America to date represent an additional \$250 million. This also equates to 2,000 jobs.

The first supplier announcement was made in July. Three new production plants would be built next to the Nissan plant. It was also announced four new production plants would be built within two miles of the Nissan plant, and another plant would be built in Vicksburg.

The second round of suppliers was announced by Nissan in November. Four of the six companies will partner with existing Mississippi firms. One supplier will build a plant in Forest and another has plans to build a plant in Vicksburg.

So far, the combined investments of Nissan and production suppliers represent \$1.1 billion and a combined 60,000 jobs. Almost 40,000 have applied for jobs at the Nissan plant.
