## MISSISSIPPI SELECTED AS SITE FOR LOCKHEED MARTIN CENTER

JACKSON, Miss., - The John C. Stennis Space Center located in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi has been selected as the site for the Lockheed Martin Propulsion Thermal and Metrology Center.

## TOURISM DIVISION CONDUCTING RECREATIONAL INVENTORY

JACKSON, Miss., September 6 – Tourism Development, a division of the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development is conducting an assessment of new outdoor recreational activities and facilities.
