BEEF PROCESSING PLANT BREAKS GROUND IN YALOBUSHA COUNTY

OAKLAND, Miss. – Governor Ronnie Musgrove, Rep. Tommy Reynolds, Rep. Billy McCoy, Robert J. Rohrlack, Jr., executive director of the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA), Lester Spell, Jr., Commissioner, Mississippi Dept. of Agriculture and other city and county officials participated in a groundbreaking ceremony for Mississippi Beef Processors, LLC. Mississippi Beef Processors, LLC, is owned by Richard Hall, who has moved his family's business back to Mississippi from Nashville, TN.
