WHEREAS, September 11, 2001, was a day of unprecedented terrorist attacks on U.S. soil, which resulted in a momentous loss of life and property; and

WHEREAS, although the goal of the terrorists was to bring our great nation to its knees, they only made us stronger as we joined together in one of the greatest relief efforts in our nation's history; and

WHEREAS, in remembrance of the victims of this great tragedy, the heroes that gave the ultimate sacrifice during the rescue efforts, and the millions of Americans that continue to be affected, the State of Mississippi will carry out the following acts of remembrance:

- **We encourage all Mississippians to fly the American flag at half-staff at your homes and businesses across the state.**
- **We request a moment of silence at precisely 7:46 a.m., Wednesday September 11, 2002.**
