Governor Appoints Larry O. Lewis as Circuit Court Judge for Eleventh District

Jackson, MS -- Governor Ronnie Musgrove has appointed Larry O. Lewis of Marks, Mississippi, as Circuit Court Judge for the Eleventh District of Mississippi.

“Larry Lewis has demonstrated his expertise in the law and his commitment to the law,” said Governor Musgrove. “I am confident he will serve the people well as Circuit Court Judge.”
