**WHEREAS**, the Mississippi Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators, Inc., (MASFAA) has chosen the month of January to focus on promoting awareness of the various opportunities for financial assistance available to qualifying citizens of Mississippi through federal, state, and institutional resources; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 100,000 Mississippians are served through Grants, Scholarships, Loans, Work Study, etc., which are funded through federal, state, local and private sources; and

**WHEREAS**, January is the time of year when students may begin applying for financial aid; and

**WHEREAS**, Financial Aid Awareness month is fully endorsed and supported by local state, and national entities including the Education Services Foundation (ESF), Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL), Mississippi Association of Colleges, Mississippi Association of Independent Colleges, Mississippi Community/Junior College Board, Mississippi Counselors Association, Mississippi Parent Teacher Association, the Mississippi State Superintendent of Education, and USA Group:
