**WHEREAS**, prayer is a fundamental part of our national heritage, with the first National Day of Prayer proclaimed by the Continental Congress in 1775; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1783, the end of a long, weary Revolutionary War marked a temporary end to the National Day of Prayer; and

**WHEREAS**, revised as an annual observance by the Congress of the United States in 1952, the National Day of Prayer has become a tremendously unifying force for our citizens from diverse religious backgrounds; and

**WHEREAS**, this nation has fervently sought divine guidance as it charted what has now become the path of American history; and

**WHEREAS**, the theme for this year's celebration is **"America United Under God-'God is our refuge and strength; an ever-present help in trouble.' Psalm 46:1"**:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim Thursday, May 2, 2002, as

**NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER**

in the State of Mississippi, and encourage all citizens to recognize it appropriately.
