He is also a member of the Mississippi Chiefs of Police, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the National Organization of Blacks in Law Enforcement, President of Mississippi Chapter of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives and a member of the Hinds County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council.

The Commission on Police Pursuit Standards and Procedures was created by Senate Bill 2446 during the 2003 Legislative Session and is charged with addressing the uniform methods and procedures of pursuit for the state which insures the safety of the public and the apprehension of criminal defenders.
