**WHEREAS**, there are 60 Boys & Girls Clubs in Mississippi providing services to more than 52,300 young people annually; and

**WHEREAS**, the Boys & Girls Clubs are at the forefront of efforts in literacy programs, homework help, tutorial assistance, substance abuse prevention, and recreation programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the Boys & Girls Clubs in our state help ensure that our young people keep off the streets, offering them a safe and supportive place to go and providing them with quality programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Mississippi will celebrate National Boys & Girls Club Week 2002, along with some 2,700 clubs and more than 3.3 million young people nationwide;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim April 7 through April 13, 2002, as

in the State of Mississippi and call upon all citizens to join me in recognizing and commending the Boys & Girls Club organizations in our state for providing comprehensive, effective services to the young people in our communities and providing a positive place for kids.
