Governor Musgrove: More Mississippians Working at M-TEK 250 to be Employed by End of Year at Nissan Supplier

(Jackson, MS) – Governor Ronnie Musgrove joined officials from M-TEK Mississippi today at the official grand opening for the Nissan supplier, saying that the facility is another indicator of the state’s growth during a national recession.

“A total of 250 Mississippians will be going to work here at M-TEK, and that’s good news for us all,” Musgrove said. “The best thing our kids can see on their way to school is their parents on the way to a good job.”

M-TEK will be a key supplier for Nissan, producing interior trim components out of its 219,000 square foot facility.

“Today’s grand opening sends another signal that Mississippi is working hard to compete in the global marketplace,” Musgrove said. “Our partnership with Nissan has helped create the jobs here at M-TEK, and we’ll continue to build on that partnership statewide.”
