

A Proclamation
by
Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, by the provisions of Section 121 of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, the Governor is vested with the power to convene, by public Proclamation, the Legislature in Extraordinary Session whenever, in his judgment, the public interest requires it; and

WHEREAS, it is my judgment that the public interest requires that the Legislature be convened in Extraordinary Session for the consideration of the matters hereinafter stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, I Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, do hereby issue this Proclamation to convene the Legislature in Extraordinary Session, and do designate Monday, August 28, 2000, at 12:00 noon, as the time, and the State Capitol in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as the place in which said Session shall be convened, and do designate as the subjects to be considered at said Extraordinary Session, when so convened, the following matters:

1. an Act in substantial conformity with the bill attached hereto;
2. such other matters as may be submitted by the Governor for consideration during such Extraordinary Session.
