

**A Proclamation**  
**by**  
**Governor Ronnie Musgrove**

**WHEREAS**, by the provisions of Section 121 of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, the Governor is vested with the power to convene, by public Proclamation, the Legislature in Extraordinary Session whenever, in his judgment, the public interest requires it; and

**WHEREAS**, it is my judgment that the public interest requires that the Legislature be convened in Extraordinary Session for the consideration of the matters hereinafter stated:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, do hereby issue this Proclamation to convene the Legislature in the Third Extraordinary Session of 2000, and do designate Monday, November 6, 2000, at 10:00 a.m., as the time, and the State Capitol in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as the place, in which said Session shall be convened; and do designate as the subjects to be considered at said Third Extraordinary Session of 2000, when so convened, the following matters:

1. an Act to induce the location of a major capital economic development project, proposed for Madison County, Mississippi.
2. an Act making an appropriation for the expenses of the legislature for the Third Extraordinary Session of 2000.
3. such other matters as may be submitted by the Governor for consideration during such Third Extraordinary Session of 2000.
