WHEREAS, the All-Volunteer Army is a uniquely American phenomenon that began as an experiment at the height of the Cold War and the quality and success of the volunteer force remains unprecedented; and

WHEREAS, 70% of Americans reported some form of charitable involvement in response to the September 11 tragedies. Volunteering provides a variety of personal benefits and satisfaction, in addition to the benefits received by nonprofit organizations and society as a whole; and

WHEREAS, today, the United States Army is recognized as the premier army in the world, with American's volunteer soldiers serving in more than 100 countries; and

WHEREAS, American soldiers are voluntarily foregoing comfort and wealth, facing hardship and sacrifice, and confronting danger in defense of the Nation, the United States Army is and will remain a testament to the success of Army recruiters in attracting the Nation's best and brightest to volunteer

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim Tuesday, July 10, 2003, as
